

Pupil Premium 2016/17

The Pupil Premium is additional funding received by the academy to raise the attainment of pupils who are currently eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) or have been eligible in the past 6 years, have been designated as a looked after child for more than 6 months, or for children whose parents are currently serving in the armed forces. The funding is used to contribute towards closing the gaps between these pupils and their peers.

In 2016/17 the allocated funding is £214,155.

Barriers to future attainment and progress of Pupil Premium students

In school barriers (issues to be addressed in school)

- Low aspirations
- Literacy and numeracy skills entering Year 7 are lower for students eligible for the Pupil Premium than for other students
- Lower levels of literacy and numeracy are leading to Pupil Premium students making less progress than others across Key Stages 3 and 4
- Behaviour issues for some Pupil Premium students are having a detrimental effect on their attainment and progress

External barriers (issues which also require action outside the school)

 Attendance and persistent absence does not match the attendance of other students

Desired outcomes and how they will be measured

Spending will be allocated to target measured improvements in:

- Literacy and numeracy scores of Year 7 students, evidenced in NGRT and Progress
 Tests
- Reading and maths scores of targeted KS3 and KS4 students, evidenced in NGRT and CLP Data
- Progress 8 scores of Year 11 Pupil Premium students, including in:
 - Mathematics element (lower prior attainment)
 - EBacc element (Science lower and middle prior attainment, Humanities lower prior attainment)
 - Open element (lower and middle prior attainment)
- Exclusions of Pupil Premium students, compared to last year
- Behaviour incidents of Pupil Premium students, by term
- Attendance rates for Pupil Premium students, compared to other students and last year
